Dear Custodian of Records,

Pursuant to the Missouri Sunshine Law, Chapter 610, RSMo, I am requesting access to specific public records pertaining to Automated License Plate Readers (ALPRs) and Flock Safety systems.

To minimize processing time and eliminate unnecessary fee estimates, I am strictly limiting the scope of this request to the following data points, and ONLY as they relate to these five specific agencies: **Ray County, Lafayette County, the City of Odessa, the City of Richmond, and the City of Higginsville.**

Please provide the following:

1. **Money Spent:** Any grant applications, award letters, or financial records of state funds disbursed to subsidize ALPR/Flock systems for the listed agencies.
2. **System Audits:** Any state-level compliance audits, oversight reviews, or logs detailing how the state monitors these agencies' utilization of the ALPR systems.
3. **Data Sharing:** Any Memorandums of Understanding (MOUs), network agreements, or transparency matrices showing which neighboring agencies have authorized access to the ALPR networks of the listed agencies.
4. **User Logins:** Any state-held logs detailing user access or system logins to ALPR networks by personnel from the listed agencies.

Per § 610.023.3, RSMo, you are required to act upon this request as soon as possible, but no later than the end of the third business day following the date this request is received.

Pursuant to § 610.026, RSMo, and the Missouri Supreme Court's ruling in *Gross v. Parson*, public agencies are strictly prohibited from charging requesters for internal attorney review or redaction time. I request that these records be provided digitally to minimize processing and copying expenses. If fees are not waived and will exceed \$25.00, please provide a binding, itemized cost estimate before compiling the records.

Thank you for your request for documents from the Missouri Department of Transportation dated 07/13/2026.

In our effort to respond as quickly as possible to requests for documents, we have specifically identified many documents that can be released immediately. If the documents you have requested are on that list, your request has been sent to that location where that file is kept and you will receive the information very quickly.

However, the Open Records statutes provide some instances where records should be closed; therefore, if the documents you have requested have not been predetermined to be Open Records, your request is currently being reviewed to see if litigation or statutory provisions require the records to be closed. Should that be the case, we will promptly advise you citing the reason for closure and the specific provisions of the law under which access is denied.

Because we are a decentralized agency with records being retained both in our central office here in Jefferson City and in our seven district offices located throughout the state, we anticipate that reviewing your request to determine if the records are open and locating and copying the records could take as long as fifteen working days. I want to assure you, however, that the process we use is an electronic one, and in many cases we are able to send the documents in a shorter period of time. Should we find that we will not be able to get the records to you within fifteen working days, we will contact you again to tell you the reason for the delay.

While we generally waive all costs for requests that involve little search and few copies, we do ask, in keeping with the statutes, that where time involved in locating the records and the volume of information is not minimal, that you pay only the actual costs involved. You will be notified of the estimated charges prior to the expense being incurred.

Any data requests would need to be made directly to the law enforcement agency that operates the cameras. All fees associated with this request have been waived and this request is now closed.
